Mental Health Week takes place May 6-12. To mark the week, Mundare School has a series of activities and lessons planned for students, all centered on Mental Health Week's theme, "Compassion Connects." We all have the capacity to be compassionate, and we know that doing so can make an enormous difference. Some of the school activities planned include:
